We invite interested participants to submit abstracts of their work related to oncology for possible presentation at the 42nd AROICON 2022.

For Submitting your Abstract you can upload it using the submission form online.

The deadline for submitting the abstracts is 31st August 2022.

To facilitate the submission process and the subsequent follow up process, please consider the following guidelines, information, tips, terms and deadlines mentioned.

- All abstracts must be submitted electronically by the appropriate deadlines.
- All material must be the work of authors listed and appropriately referenced.
- Abstract submission requires compulsory registration.
- In case your abstract is not selected and you choose not to attend the conference, your registration amount will be refunded, as per cancellation policy.
- One candidate can participate in more than one category.

We encourage you to send informative abstract (complete abstract) which is a compendious summary of a paper's substance including its title, background, purpose, methodology, results and conclusion. Text may be in multiple paragraphs.

Result of your abstract submission will be notified maximum by 31st September 2022.

Proffered Paper Presentation

- The maximum word limit for the abstract should not exceed 500 words.
- Your time for Paper presentation will be 06 minutes for presentation and 2 minutes for Q&A.
- Presentation should be in PPT format and not more than 8 slides.

About Delhi

Delhi, city and national capital territory, north-central India. The city of Delhi actually consists of two components: Old Delhi, in the north, the historic city; and New Delhi, in the south, since 1947 the capital of India, built in the first part of the 20th century as the capital of British India.

One of the country's largest urban agglomerations, Delhi sits astride (but primarily on the west bank of) the Yamuna River, a tributary of the Ganges (Ganga) River, about 100 miles (160 km) south of the Himalayas. The national capital territory embraces Old and New Delhi and the surrounding metropolitan region, as well as adjacent rural areas. To the east the territory is bounded by the state of Uttar Pradesh, and to the north, west, and south it is bounded by the state of Haryana.

No visit to Delhi is complete without an experience of its famed specialties such as its delicious curries, barbecued tikkas and kebabs. It is also a shoppers' haven, whether you want to pick up some rich, woven silks, handicrafts, or ethnic cushions for your home. For cuisine of different Indian states and an array of Indian art and craft there are three Dilli Haats in Delhi at INA, Pitampura and the brand new Dilli Haat at Janakpuri.

It is time to celebrate this city which is a symbol of the country's rich past and thriving present. As a Capital city it is fittingly a window to the country. So come and look out of the window and discover a whole new city of numerous stories and experiences.



Gurudwara Bangla Sahib is one of the most prominent Sikh gurdwara, or Sikh house of worship, in Delhi, India, and known for its association with the eighth Sikh Guru, Guru Har Krishan, as well as the holy pond inside its complex, known as the "Sarovar." It is situated near Connaught Place, New Delhi on Baba Kharak Singh Marg and it is instantly recognisable by its golden dome and tall flagpole, Nishan Sahib. Located next to it is the Sacred Heart Cathedral.



Swaminarayan Akshardham is a Hindu temple, and spiritual-cultural campus in Delhi, India. The temple is close to the border with Noida. Also referred to as Akshardham Temple or Akshardham Delhi, the complex displays millennia of traditional and modern Hindu culture, spirituality, and architecture. Inspired by Yogiji Maharaj and created by Pramukh Swami Maharaj, it was constructed by BAPS.



The India Gate (formerly known as the All India War Memorial) is a war memorial located astride the Rajpath, on the eastern edge of the "ceremonial axis" of New Delhi, formerly called Kingsway. It stands as a memorial to 84,000 soldiers of the British Indian Army who died in between 1914 and 1921 in the First World War, in France,



The Lotus Temple, located in Delhi, India, is a Bahá'í House of Worship that was dedicated in December 1986. Notable for its flowerlike shape, it has become a prominent attraction in the city. Like all other Bahá'í Houses of Worship, the Lotus Temple is open to all, regardless of religion or any other qualification. The building is composed of 27 free-standing marble-clad "petals" arranged in clusters of three to form nine sides, with nine doors opening onto a central hall with a height of slightly over 34 meters and a capacity of 1,300 people. The Lotus Temple has won numerous architectural awards and has been featured in many newspaper and magazine articles.

Weather & Transportaion

Winter in Delhi

Winter begins in Delhi from the month of December, experiencing extremely low temperature. The season continues till January. The temperature varies from 22°C to 5°C during this period.

Tips :- Woolen clothes are recommended during winters.

How to Reach Delhi

The Delhi is regarded as a hub of administration, finance and IT with its prominent surroundings of NCR (National Capital Region) Noida and Gurgaon. The capital city of India is making continuous progress and draws tourists from all over the world. The city is also frequented by the politicians from various countries. If one is planning to visit this city of historical beauty, he or she should not worry about how to reach there. As Delhi is well connected in terms of airways, railways and roadways one can easily reach there through any mode of transport according to their convenience.

Air

The Indira Gandhi International Airport, which is the biggest airport of India, is located in the western part of Delhi. All the major cities of the world are connected through all terminals of Indira Gandhi International Airport, popularly known as the New Delhi Airport. The flights to major domestic cities have access from the same terminal. It provides excellent facilities like cafeteria, shopping centers, coffee shops, duty free shops, eating outlets, cyber cafes and many more. You can plan your journey from any part of India and can have a hassle traveling experience.

Road

The state bus service providers Delhi Transport Corporation (DTC), operates the largest fleet of CNG buses. These eco-friendly buses connect the city with other neighboring cities through road routes. The three major bus terminus of Delhi are Inter State Bus Terminus (ISBT) at Kashmiri Gate, Sarai Kale-Khan Bus Terminus and Anand Vihar Bus Terminus that operate buses for several routes.

Rail

Being the headquarter of Northern Railways Delhi is considered as a major railway junctions according to the rail map of India. There are two major Railway Stations in the capital city - the New Delhi Railway Station and the Old Delhi Railway Station, connecting the city with other prominent cities of the country. Besides, there are substitutes like the Nizamuddin Railway Station, Sarai Rohilla and Anand Vihar Railway Station.

Tourist Attractions in Delhi

Why Visit Delhi ?

Delhi is the capital city of India. It is the second largest city by population after Mumbai and receives a huge tourist traffic all around the year be it from India or from distant lands abroad. Why is that Delhi is such a popular tourist destination or let us twist the question to say why is that you should visit Delhi once in your lifetime.

1. Architectural Splendour

The history of Delhi names some great kings as its rulers and it is noteworthy that these kings erected grand structures here to signify the glory of their dynasty. Mughal empire and British Empire, both are seen as the ones who have done some brilliant constructions in their times. On one hand, the grandeur of Red Fort is admired by all and on the other, the mightiness of Rashtrapati Bhawan (originally built as the Viceroy's lodge by the British) leaves the spectator spell bound!
