5. It was brought to the notice of the house that, Post PG ICRO programs that was previously sponsored by Dr Reddy Labs would no longer be available. From this year DRL would

not be sponsoring. The general body was informed by the Dr. Rajesh Vashistha that they are in talks with Accuray for sponsoring this program.

- 6. The GBM voted that AROICON 2020 is to be held in New Delhi ,Dr. K T Bhowmik will be organising Chairman & the host institute being Saftarjung Hospital ,New Delhi and under banner of north zone chapter of AROI.
- 7. Finance report was presented by the general secretary and approved by GBM (Proposed by Dr Srinivasan and seconded by Dr Bhowmik)

- 8. Dr Rakesh Kapoor proposed that AROI to become a member of Non Communicable Diseases Federation, the fees for which will be Rs. 10,000/-, lifetime Institutional membership. Accepted by EC and General body. Seconded by Dr Vijay Anand Reddy
- 9. Dr Kishore Singh submitted that he needs more funding for publishing the Journal. He has asked for increase in funding from 12 Lakhs to 32 Lakhs. The EC felt that it would be difficult to arrange 32 lakhs yearly and asked the editor JCRT to look for avenues to raise money and also to cut down the prints of the publication. Dr Kishore Singh was also asked to give more details of the budget and the editor said he would do.

The proposal to increase the yearly subscription towards the JCRT fees to Rs 25,000 from state chapters was discussed and rejected by the house, to continue with Rs. 15000/year, every chapter is requested to pay their due amount.

10. Dr. Francis also raised a query regarding facilities given to past orators and faculty. He mentioned there is no clarity to this. The EC committee after referring to by-laws came to a conclusion that registration and to and fro travel have to be arranged by the faculty themselves, the organising committee will provide local accommodation and local transport.

The GBM decided to amend the bylaws regarding removing the facilities provided to past orators, and also to clearly mention the facilities to be provided to faculty. It was decided to put up the changes on website for members to review and comment, & based on this the next GBM will ratify the changes. Regards to who constitutes faculty i.e. whether chairpersons, panellists and speakers are considered faculty,

it was decided by the house only the speakers are to be considered as faculty and local transport and accommodation would be provided by the organisers to them in the end it decided to be reviewed by committee.

11. Dr Vijay Anand Reddy proposed the following — Creation of some working Committee groups to have more dedicated members working for the AROI and focus on specific issues and help the Central body.

- a) Clinical affairs and Quality Control Sub Committee

The Executive Committee has agreed for the above committees to be formed and the house has unanimously agreed to reorganise the existing committees to help the central committee in functioning more effectively.

All the above councils will be nominated by President& Secretary of AROI.

Re-designate the immediate past President AROI as Chair AROI. The Chair AROI would perceive the initiatives initiated during his tenure and assist the President, Secretary AROI in their activities. Proposed by Dr Rajesh Vasishta and seconded by Dr Manoj Gupta.

TO BE GIVEN TO CONSTITUTION COMMITTEE

- 12. It was proposed by Dr Vijay Anand reddy to increase the fund to be given to AROI central, after all AROICON's to 20 lakhs from the current 12 lakhs. This was accepted by GBM and would come into effect from AROICON 2020 conference.
- 13. It was decided to have AROI outreach programs with other professional bodies if there is no financial obligation on AROI. Proposed by Dr Vijay Anand reddy and seconded by Dr Manoj Gupta.
- 14. It was proposed by Dr Vijay anand reddy to allow observer-ship programs in India for international students through AROI. The EC approved and suggested that AROI website have a link to details of institutions, facilities available and fees if any to be paid by the candidate.
- 15. It was proposed to have one female EC member to be designated as female representative. The GBM decided if there

is no female EC member then the EC will nominate one as female representative.

- 16. It was decided in the GBM to provide financial assistance to members who are presenting papers in major international conferences (ASTRO, ESTRO, FARO & ABS). It was decided to support 5 members a year in this regard after selection by the scientific committee and the assistance will be Rs 20,000 per member, in total Rs 1 lakh a year. Proposed by Dr Vijay anand reddy seconded by Dr Vashistha.
- 17. The proposals of Dr Suresh Kumar –Kerela AROI Secretary Dr. Suresh Kumar spoke& brought to notice of GBM.
- 1. Establishment of district cancer centers. 2. Fellowship program in community Oncology, Fellowship in Comprehensive Palliative Care, Fellowship in Cancer Research. GBM has agreed that AROI central body would represent and recommend to the Govt
- 18. Dr. Vijay Anand Reddy, President AROI explained in detail that it is discussed several times in the past GBMs and a resolution was passed in this regard. Subsequently, The AROI Central body has written to the MCI to change the MD Radiotherapy Nomenclature to MD (Radiation Oncology). It was also communicated to them that it is the AROI General Body resolution.
- Dr. Vijay Anand Reddy has requested Dr Suresh Kumar & Dr Sabari not to be apprehensive about this nomenclature and it is good for the years to come. He has also requested them not to create confusion in the Court or at MCI.

DM Courses — DM Courses — Dr Suresh Kumar & Dr Sabari raised Concerns about the Super Specialities Courses in Radiation Oncology. Dr Vijay Anand Reddy has clarified their apprehensives and explained the importance and need to have such courses in our Country in the interest of Radiation oncology community and improve the patient care. He has also made them aware that it was discussed in General Body meeting at Bangalore and the mandate was to go ahead with DM proposals, proposed by Dr.Ramesh Bilimaga, seconded by Dr Kishore Singh.

The proposals were sent to MCI after the General Body meeting at Bangalore. The proposals were positively considered by MCI and the academic Council has formally approved and was sent for fine tuning the Syllabus.

Dr. Reddy has assured that it will be perceived further seriously and it would be done once the new MCI board is formed.but house again divided how to go forwarded, so a subcommittee to be established & to see the way for go forwarded.

Stereotactic Radiotherapy for Lung Cancer

Prof. K T Dinshaw Memorial Oration

During 40th Annual conference of Association of Radiation Oncologists of India (AROICON — 2018)

Trivandrum, Kerala, India from 29th November to 2nd December 2018

SBRT (or SABR) is a form of high-precision, image-guided radiotherapy, which is used to deliver a very high-dose in just a few (typically 3-5) fractions. In stage I NSCLC, it leads to 2-3 year overall survival rates of around 55% and a local control rate in excess of 90%.

The randomized Chisel Study [Ball et al., WCLC 2017] showed a benefit of SBRT over conventional radiotherapy for both local control and overall survival. SBRT has replaced conventional radiotherapy for early stage NSCLC and is also becoming an alternative for surgery.

We have used risk adapted schemes, where we deliver 54-60 Gy in 3-8 fractions, depending on tumor size and location. This led to 5yr local and regional control rates of around 90% and 5 yr distant control of around 80% [Senthi, Lancet Oncol 2012]. The implementation of SBRT led to an increased use of radiotherapy in the Netherland in elderly stage I NSCLC patients [Palma JCO 2010].

In this presentation, a few important isssues were addressed:

- Almost all patients will develop radiographic changes after SBRT. Differentiation between recurrence and fibrosis can be challenging. A number of high-risk features, including sequential enlargement, enlarging opacity after 12 months, and growth in cranio-caudal direction [Huang et al., Green J 2013].
- 2. The risk of (fatal) pneumonitis is higher in patients with interstitial lung disease. These patients presenting with honeycombing aspects of the lungs on their pretreatment CT scan require attention by specialized pulmonologists since they have a 15-20% risk of fatal pneumonitis after

SBRT [Chen, WCLC 2016; Bahig, PRO 2016].

- 3. Central tumors can safely be treated with an adapted fractionation scheme (eg 5-8 fractions), but "ultracentral" tumors where the PTV overlaps with trachea and/or bronchi carry a significant risk of (fatal) toxicity [Hasseltine, PRO 2016; Tekatli, JTO 2016].
- SBRT can also be used in larger lesions (>5cm); In these
 patients median survival rates of 2-2,5 years were
 recorded and the main site of recurrence was distant
 metastases [Tekatli, JTO 2017].
- MRI guided radiotherapy with daily adaptation of the plan and MRI-guided breathhold techniques may lead to better PTV coverage and better sparing of surrounding tussue
- 6. Non-randomized studies comparing the outcome after SBRT and Surgery typically show a better survival of the SBRT group in the first year, due to lack of operative mortality, and worse survival thereafter due to more comorbidity in the SBRT group [Palma JCO 2010]. Three randomized controlles trials comparing surgery and SBRT were prematurely closed due to poor accrual. The results of two of these studies were combined and showed at least equipoise between the two arms, albeit with only 58 patients [Chang/Senan, Lancet Oncol 2015]. The results of still open studies, including the VALOR and STABLEMATES trial are awated. Outside of clinical trials, especially in patients with more than standard operative risk, objective patient information and shared decision making with the patients is very important

The 40th Annual Conference of Association of Radiation Oncologists of India (AROICON2018) was held from 29th Nov-2nd Dec 2018 at GV Raja Convention Centre and Uday Samudra Leisure Beach Hotel & Spa, Kovalam, Trivandrum, India. This year's theme was 'Exploring the Art and Science of Oncology'.

The ICRO CME activity on 29th focused on 'Imaging and Contouring'. The eminent faculty included Dr Priya A ,Dr Jiji V, Dr K C Patro , Dr JG Sastri, Dr S G Laskar, Dr S Chatterjee , Dr Z Thotathil, Dr R Jacob , Dr R Engineer and Dr S J Sastri.

The conference was inaugurated on 30th evening by the Hon'ble Governor of Kerala, Justice (Retd) Sri P Sathasivam. 
